Don McGlinchie even 'popped' down for a four hour stint bringing with him his Emeryville and his photo album which contained some fabulous history of the truck.



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM) IS TO BE HELD AT 10.00AM ON 25 JULY 2021 AT THE PREMISES OF METROPOLITAN TOWING, 2/17 SUNBLEST CRESCENT, MOUNT DRUITT.

AT THE AGM THERE WILL BE THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND VOTING ON THE PROPOSED SCHEDULE OF BY-LAWS, AS LISTED BELOW.

I. Membership

- Renewal of membership by June 30th ensures your Personal Accident and Public Liability Insurance will be renewed before its expiry on July 31 and new Membership/ Insurance Cards issued.
- New members who pay their fees between March 30th and June 30th will be covered
 by insurance during this period and will be credited with membership for the full year
 following. They will receive their Membership Cards as soon as possible once payment
 is received.
- 3. Payment may be made by completing the Membership form and mailing it, together with payment, to the Club's postal address, bring it to a club meeting, or pay by direct credit EFT (see the form for instructions).
- 4. After 30 days from the 30th June,
 - a) The Treasurer shall provide a list of non-financial members to the Registrar, Secretary, President and Newsletter editor on or before 31 July.
 - b) New membership conditions will apply to unfinancial members wanting to renew their membership.
- 5. The Secretary shall submit in writing to the members with trucks on historic registration, the intention to advise RMS to cancel the registration of the member's truck(s).
- 6. Unfinancial members will be removed from the mailing list for newsletters.

2. <u>Life Membership</u>

A member considered worthy of Life Membership status must have exhibited exemplary service to the club for a period of ten years or more.

The decision to admit a member to life member status shall be determined by a meeting of the committee with a minimum 2/3 majority vote in favour.

A member who attains Life Member status shall be exempt from paying future annual membership fees. But is not exempt from other membership requirements.

Schedule of By-Laws continued:

3. <u>Historic Registration</u>

- a. The Western Sydney Historical Truck Club Inc. (WSHTC) is authorised by the NSW Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) to administer the registration of historic vehicles under the Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS).
- b. Only vehicles eligible for registration under the HVS regulations will be considered for historic registration.
- c. All vehicles must be a minimum of 30 years old, and vehicles submitted for registration must first be approved by the Committee. Vehicles that do not comply with the aims of the Club will not be accepted.
- d. Registration is only available to those who have been members for 12 months or more. To qualify for historic registration a member must be financial and attend a minimum of 3 events during the first year of membership. After this, attendance at a minimum of 2 club events per year is required to keep the registration. At each event, the member must sign the attendance book.
- e. The twelve-month wait for Historic Registration may be waived at the Committee's discretion.
- f. The Club accepts vehicles in the following categories, including: Vehicles up to 3.5T GVM (light commercial vehicles)
 Vehicles over 3.5T GVM (trucks)
- g. A member's primary vehicle must be a truck. This excludes utes and small vans unless it reflects the transport industry and is at the committee's discretion.
- h. For new registrations, owners will be required to submit details of their vehicle to the Club Registrar, who will submit the application to the Committee.
- i. The Club's ability to register trucks is governed by the rules for historic vehicles set by the RMS. For new registrations or renewals, the member will be required to supply a pink slip from a private service station for each truck to be registered. Electronic "Pink Slip" inspection reports are not accepted by RMS for Historic Vehicles.
- j. The member must supply a copy of the pink slip and completed registration papers, as well as the originals to the Club's Registrar, either in person at a Club meeting, or by arrangement, or mailed to the club's postal address for stamping.
- k. In all cases, only original documents may be submitted to RMS (not copies), and the forms MUST bear the club's official stamp and signature of the Club Vehicle Registrar. Failure to arrange this invalidates the registration.

Schedule of By-Laws - Historic Registration continued:

- I. Copies are for the Club's historic registration records, as required by the RMS. If the member does not abide by these rules, the registration will not be approved by the Club's Registrar or will be cancelled. If a member's membership expires, then the registration of all the member's trucks under historic registration will also expire.
- m. When a member sells a vehicle registered on historic plates with the club, the Registrar must be advised so that club and RMS records can be amended.
- n. When a vehicle that is registered on historic plates with the club, is reregistered with another club, the Registrar must be advised so that club and RMS records can be amended.

4. Attendance at Club Organised or Supported Events

At each event attended, a member must sign the attendance book. This is for the purpose of insurance cover for the member under the Club's Insurance policy.

In the event of an attendance book not being available, a member must advise the registrar of their attendance at the event stating details such as date, event name and location.

5. Length of Term a Committee Member May Hold Office

There is no maximum number of consecutive terms for which a committee member may hold office.

6. Winding up of the Association

On the winding up of the Club, surplus property of the Club, is to be sold and the proceeds to be dispersed at the discretion of the Committee, at the time.

We haven't used that repairman since...


Member Profile - Michael Mifsud

Michael was born in Greystanes where he spent the first 33 or so years of life with his parents, 4 brothers and 2 sisters. His father drove trucks for a living, and consequently so did Michael. His first job was driving for Western Earth Moving (WEM) and he worked with them for 27 years. When he was 26 he bought his own truck, a 1969 C1810 ACCO single axle tipper, and continued to work with WEM on contract. Several years later he bought a 1997 8-wheel 2350 International agitator and worked on the Metro train tunnels until his Retirement four years ago. Michael's interest nowadays is vintage trucks. He first became

interested in 2007 when he found his father's old truck, a 1946 K4

International after 40 years. There was an argument at some point in time, and Michael's eldest brother finished up with the truck, much to Michael's disappointment. Michael's first vintage truck is a 1947-1949 International KB5. When he first got it, it was in poor condition. He has painstakingly restored it over a 12 year period, to better than show room condition.

Requirements for Historic Registration:

For vehicles previously registered on historical plates, you will need the following:

- 1. RMS Conditional Registration Renewal form (sent to you by RMS prior to renewal);
- 2. "Historic Vehicle Declaration" form, duly filled out with you and your trucks details, (Do not fill out the club registrar's part)
- 3. "Pink Slip" available from a local mechanics garage.

<u>For vehicles NOT previously registered on historic plates</u>, you will need to fill out a registration application form plus you will need item 2. and item 3. above.

Send all originals <u>plus a copy of each</u> to Steve Pardey, PO Box 3140, Rouse Hill, 2155

Steve will return the originals to you after he has completed his part of the process so that you can then go to the RMS to complete the historic registration of your vehicle.

Remember to fill out your log book before taking your truck out on the road.
